WHO WE ARE

Neighborhood Services Organization is a nearly 100-year-old nonprofit organization serving the at-risk and homeless in the Oklahoma City community. NSO's programs provide housing solutions and healthcare options that transform lives.

HOUSING

NSO operates three transitional housing programs and two permanent housing programs. Residents are provided with a safe, healthy home, life-skills classes and case management services. They each enjoy their own personal space as well as the strong community bond that exists among the residents. With NSO, they all have a family.



NSO's housing programs include:

Martha's House & Gatewood - Temporary, supportive housing for homeless mothers and their children.

Carolyn Williams Center - A safe, supervised home for young men ages 18-23 who are homeless or who have aged out of foster care and have no place else to go.

Palo Duro I & II - Permanent supportive housing for homeless adults with a diagnosed mental illness.

Keeping In Touch Program (KIT) - Continued support as residents transition to independent living.

WIC CLINIC

NSO also operates Oklahoma's largest Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Clinic to serve low-income and at-risk individuals. This program provides nutritional education, supplemental foods and assistance to mothers with infants.

NSO's clinic holds weekly breastfeeding classes, general nutrition classes, high-risk classes and lactation consultations. These classes are offered in both English and Spanish. The clinic also has two full-time registered dietitians on staff.



NSO DENTAL CLINIC

NSO operates a low-cost dental clinic, which provides affordable dental procedures and preventative care for individuals in the Oklahoma City and surrounding areas.

The dental clinic is a state-of-the-art facility and provides a full range of procedures at a fraction of the cost of private dental care. There are no income requirements to qualify for services and the clinic is open to the public.

VOLUNTEERING

NSO loves volunteers! The organization couldn't deliver its mission without the time and talents provided by generous volunteers who provide life-skills training, prepare meals, sponsor activities for residents, and so much more.
